What is the Student Engagement Survey?

The Student Engagement Survey (SES) is an annual survey that provides students with an opportunity to share their thoughts and feelings about various aspects of their school environment, such as:

- classroom instruction
- school climate
- relationships with teachers and peers

Why Does NDDPI Require Students to Take the Survey?

Statewide student survey results are used by the state to report school quality as part of the state's accountability system.

Student engagement is a key indicator of success! Summary feedback across all students regarding their learning experiences can assist educational leaders to understand what students need for their success and support professional development for their school or district.

Can Schools See Individual Student Responses?

No. Students log into the survey with unique individual credentials so the state can confirm participation, but schools do not see individual student responses.

Who Takes the Survey?

All students in grades 3-12 who are actively enrolled in a North Dakota public school during the survey window participate in the survey administration.

 \square pay attention to other things.

 \Box do the work I have to do.
